I then moved on to the Ranakpur Jain Temple built by King Dharma Shah in the 15th Century in honour of the Jain God Tirthankara Adinatha. I also visited Bheed Ka Bidla, a village adopted by Club Mahindra whereby they provide education, funds and other necessities to help the village prosper.
