The fair value of each grant has been determined based on different expected lives of the options that vest each year, as it would be, if the grants were viewed as several separate grants each with a different vesting date. A weighted average of the vests has been calculated to arrive at the values of the options granted under the scheme.

(c) how expected volatility was determined, including an explanation of the extent to which expected volatility was based on historical volatility:

Volatility is the measure of the amount by which a price has fluctuated or is expected to fluctuate during a period. The measure of volatility used in the Black-Scholes options pricing model is

the annualized standard deviation of the continuously compounded rates of return on the stock over a period of time. For calculating volatility, the daily volatility of the stock prices on the National Stock Exchange of India Limited, over a period prior to the date of grant, corresponding with the expected life of the options has been considered.

(d) whether and how any other features of the option grant were incorporated into the measurement of fair value, such as a market condition:

Besides key assumptions stated above, no other features of the options grant were considered while measuring the fair value.
